The Perfect Storm

- Debt Ceiling
- Sequestration
  - OSHA Lose \$46 million (8.2%) (81 FTEs?) \$524 million
  - MSHA Lose \$31 million (8.2%) \$352 million
  - NIOSH ? But CDC losing 8.2% = \$464 million
- Continuing Resolution Expires


