Hello Dear Anna, I hope this note finds you in good health and recovering from a wonderful Christmas day! I write to inform you that, unfortunately, I will NOT be able to attend the YPSW annual meeting again this year. Carolyn and I are both doing somewhat better. After a number of radiation therapy treatments, including one course focused on the skull, Carolyn's current chemo treatment for metastatic breast cancer in her bones is maintaining the progression at a measured pace. She is scheduled for some further treatment and diagnostics next week and that is my first priority.

In October, I had my aortic heart valve replaced and pacemaker inserted to keep the ticker going. Was amazing as the replacement procedure is a relatively new one (TAVR) that is similar to a stent placement, except that the stent is inserted into the existing heart valve, opens the valve fully and stent contains a bio-heart valve (cow tissue in my case) within the stent, and starts working immediately upon implantation. Insertion of the stent created a complete heart block for the electrical signal needed and a miniature pacemaker was inserted the same way (through a femoral artery) and placed in the bottom right ventricle. It is a small fully self-contained pacemaker, about 1 inch long and 0.25 in diameter tube that keeps the ticker going. Apparently good for at least 12 years. (I put a tickler on my date book to make an appointment for replacement in 11 years/11 months!!!) Only one overnight in hospital and up and about next day. I am feeling much, much better now and looking forward to getting in more activity.

In approaching retirement, I joined the local Elks Lodge a couple of years ago. Last year, I was elected the president of the local Palo Alto Elks Lodge, so have been very busy leading that benevolent organization, a really good group that does great volunteer work with veterans and children in need. (I have to say the only reason I agreed was to gain the official title: In Elks Lodges, the president equivalent title is actually and officially "Exalted Ruler" so everyone has to address me as "Exalted Ruler", which is good for my ego!! Ha Ha)

I am saddened that I won't be there for your last meeting as Secretary/Treasurer, but want to thank you for your selfless service to YPSW. You, and Doug before you, have been so instrumental in the on-going success of this organization. Your participation, guidance and willingness to support YPSW all these years is something special and getting to know you as part of YPSW is one of the great joys of my association. Know that you are a dear treasure and YPSW would not be what it is today without your many years of support and excellent counsel.
